If on tube feeds:	sennosides syrup 15 mL by NG Q12H								
Level 3 - Notify physician if no BM within 48 hrs									
THEN:	sennosides A&B 24 mg PO BID								
AND:	magnolax 60 mL PO at HS								
If on tube feeds:	sennosides syrup 30 mL by NG Q12H								
Level 4 - If no BM for further 24 hrs, assess for impaction &						bowel sounds & call MD			
If impacted & stool is soft	Disimpact manually								
If impacted & stool is hard	Instill 100mL mineral oil PR HSx1								
followed by:	cleansing enema in AM								
Level 5 - If no BM for further 24 hrs, call physician									
THEN:	Fleet or tap water enema PR x1 dose								
If patient has a BM in any of above LEVELS, return to Level II as a maintenance regimen
